

The Bigger Picture

What is it?

A team based exercise in artistic creativity.

The Bigger Picture is a message-laden activity where delegates produce their own pieces of art before a final unexpected twist. The amateur artists are forced to take a step back, look at 'The Bigger Picture' and re-assess their own views and approaches to work.

How does it work?

Divided into small teams of 2-5 people and supplied with the necessary materials, the potential Picassos are challenged to recreate an apparently abstract work of art onto their own small canvasses.

Multiple skills are required to achieve this. Somebody could be in charge of measurements and dimensions, others deal with sketching, brush strokes and mixing colours; everyone is able to contribute.

After an allocated amount of time, teams can move around the room and take over other teams' work. As they rotate, will people be happy to leave their own art to someone else, and will they feel obliged to alter others'?

Group effort and co-operation is needed to complete the art, but that is not the final outcome.

Unbeknown to the teams, once all the individual pieces of vibrant art are complete and brought together, their combined efforts unite to form a single 'Bigger Picture' by a renowned artist – reflecting your business or message.

After this realisation, a trained facilitator guides teams through their experiences and learning points, and coaches them in ways to take these insights into the workplace. The larger painting is mounted to create a memento of the exercise – a reminder of each individual's potential for creativity and the whole teams' collective output.

Variations


Helping Hands:

Delegates write down personal aims and objectives, and then make a coloured print of their palm – with each finger symbolising one of these goals.

The completed prints are cut out, combined and then laid out to reproduce a larger mosaic of your company logo, artist's work or key image, before being unveiled to all.

Shaping the Future:

Given carving and painting tools, teams work on foam blocks to create a 3D image of their core values, visions and goals. In the finale we reveal that each team's masterpiece is part of a much larger sculpture. The teams combine their carved blocks into a mighty company totem pole!
